Position Profile:

The Regina Area requires the services of a dynamic and team-oriented fellowship trained Urogynecologist to join the Regina Area Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology. The successful candidate will join the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology in Regina, Saskatchewan, covering on call duties, operating room time and clinic duties.

Urogynecologists maintain a fee-for-service, independent practice within Regina. There is currently one practicing Urogynecologist in Regina. A city-wide pooled referrals system for gynecology consultation will support the successful candidate in establishing practice. Annually there are over 600 urogynecology referrals. Call coverage is shared with a patient-centered and very collegial call group within the specialty and an on-call premium is provided for on-call availability. Participation in the Gynecology call rota will be mandatory. Participation in the Obstetrical call rota will be optional, based on the successful candidate's choice to have an obstetrical practice.

Gynecological and Obstetrical services are based at the Regina General Hospital. The operating theatres have recently been renovated and are state of the art for minimally invasive gynecologic surgery. All gynecologic surgeons are allocated a minimum of one day per month in the main operating theatre. Further allocation is given to individual surgeons based on patient waitlists. Cystoscopy is provided in the ambulatory endoscopy suite at the Regina General Hospital and will be available for a minimum of one-half day per month. The Women's Health Centre provides outpatient gynecologic procedures including hysteroscopy and colposcopy. Access to the Women's Health Centre procedure rooms will also be available based on the successful candidate's preferred scope of gynecologic practice.

The Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA) is dedicated to learning and is a partner in the growing educational needs of medical students and residents from the College of Medicine, University of Saskatchewan. The successful candidate will be eligible for a teaching appointment with the College of Medicine.

The Community:

Regina is the capital of Saskatchewan, Canada and is a beautiful oasis on the prairies with a steadily growing population exceeding 230,000. According to MacLean's Best Communities in Canada 2019, Regina came in second in the Prairies and 74th across the country, scoring well in population growth, commute, amenities and culture. Regina was Canada's 33rd fastest-growing community in 2019, adding 12.7 per cent more residents over the past five years. Regina is known for its generous, friendly people and rich community pride, fueled by the "I Love Regina" campaign. This welcoming prairie city has an abundance of parks, sports and recreational facilities, bicycle pathways, family attractions and an exceptional quality of life. Qualifications:

The successful candidate will hold certification from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (RCPSC) in Obstetrics and Gynecology, be eligible for regular licensure from the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan (CPSS), and have completed fellowship training in Urogynecology.

This individual should be a team player, be able to interact effectively with patients, colleagues, staff and management, and function well in a high-volume environment with a commitment to provision of high quality patient and family centered care.

In accordance with immigration requirements, preference will be given to Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Canada.
