SOGC Past Presidents (1998-2004)

Communications Division, Archives

1 - **Dr. Thomas Baskett**, SOGC's fifty-fifth President (1998-1999), made sure that the National Office provided excellent services to members. He is remembered for his "word list". Keywords were spelled out and he invited the staff to use the proper English terminology in their communication tasks and routine activities. The Society became increasingly involved in maternal mortality initiatives. The Society's mission statement was consequently modified to include International Health. The FIGO Save the Mothers Project was launched afterwards with the collaboration of the Society's Ugandan colleagues. The ALARM programme was rapidly becoming a sought-after course for continuing medical education. SOGC continued to lobby the CMPA in getting involved with risk identification and management. Dr. Baskett collaborated with ALARM International and also contributed to many chapters of the ALARM Manual.

2 - **Dr. Robert Gauthier** was SOGC's fifty-sixth President (1999-2000). The ob/gyn membership was on a steady growth and in September 1999, SOGC forwarded an accreditation request to the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (RCPSC) to be recognized as an organization for continuous professional development in Obstetrics-Gynaecology. The first SOGC Contraception Awareness Project (CAP), funded by a \$3 million grant provided by major oral contraceptive pharmaceutical firms, was developed, allowing for public education programmes on sexuality and contraception (e.g. sexualityandu.ca). SOGC increased its International Women's Health (IWH) Programme and divided it into four different initiatives: 1) Projects funded by International Agencies, 2) Partnership projects (CIDA), 3) Projects entirely funded by the SOGC, and 4) Other collaborative projects partially funded by the SOGC. The Society's financial position was in great shape and provided with a modest reserve. The National Office's organizational structure was revamped creating new divisions (Corporate; Finances, Services to Members & Integrated Systems of Management; Communications; Education & Government Relations; and, CPD).

3 - **Dr. Thirza Smith** was SOGC's fifty-seventh President (2000-2001). The outcome of the Society's second strategic plan (1995-2000) revealed new heights in membership services, international health and clinical practice guidelines. SOGC Council approved over 14 guidelines and reviewed many more in one single year. A new strategic plan (2000-2005) was developed stating five new strategic directions i.e. CPD, Women's Health Issues, Practice Environment, Promotion of the Specialty and International Health. SOGC developed a Risk Management project; the MORE^{OB} programme, and enhanced the CAP programme. Progress was also made in terms of CMPA's involvement in risk management. SOGC developed a risk management project specifically created for endoscopy. Two important documents were published: "Women's Health 2000" and *A Guide for Health*

Professionals Working with Aboriginal Peoples, the first such document in Canada. The Society's IWH programmes were recognized as FIGO's best sponsored programmes.

4 - **Dr. Jan Christilaw**, SOGC's fifty-eighth President (2001-2002), was committed to women's health and to sexual and reproductive issues. The Society implemented a very progressive and innovative Risk Management initiative that enhanced the practice environment and helped the specialty move out of the high risk medico-legal group. SOGC lobbied the Romanow Commission and made a presentation to Mr. Romanow on the plight of obstetrical care in Canada. In July 2001, JOGC was added to the Index Medicus in recognition of its excellence. One of Dr. Christilaw's presidential highlights was the launch of the sexualityandu.ca website in collaboration with CAP. Dr. Christilaw also participated in obstetrical care initiatives for native communities.

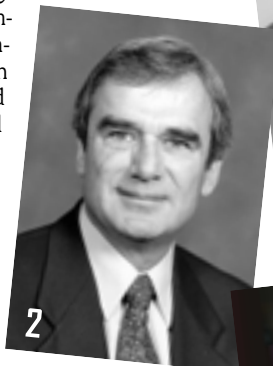
5 - **Dr. Donna Fedorkow**, SOGC's fifty-ninth President (2002-2003), is remembered for using the Presidential gavel to call members to order! SOGC hired a third physician executive, Dr. Vyta Senikas, to serve as an Associate Executive Vice-President. SOGC also lobbied for the election of Dr. D. Shaw as President-Elect of FIGO. The results of the Women's Health Initiatives Study were released and a multidisciplinary working group was created to prepare a policy statement, respond to

media inquiries and update the consensus guidelines on osteoporosis and menopause. CBC's Disclosure broadcast on the Diane 35[®] contraceptive and the risk of DVT programme, prompted the Society to put together yet another multidisciplinary panel of experts to respond to media inquiries. A draft legislative bill on Assisted Reproductive Technologies (ARTs), Bill C-13, was presented to the House of Commons and SOGC was asked to present a brief.

6 - **Dr. David Young** served as SOGC's sixtieth President (2003-2004). The National Office was preparing for its 60th Anniversary Celebration while major renovations were being made to the National Office to provide additional working space for SOGC projects. The Society also introduced its new logo. The SOGC marketed the MORE^{OB} Programme in all parts of Canada and, in partnership with

ACOG, launched the programme in the US in 2004. SOGC had a rough time negotiating the terms to repurchase the JOGC rights sold in 1989. Rogers agreed to the sale in November 2003. SOGC supported Bill C-6 (previously Bill C-13; An Act Respecting Assisted Human Reproduction and Research) and lobbied to have infertility treatments covered under Medicare. SOGC joined other specialty societies in a new national organization, the Federation of National Specialty Societies of Canada (FNSSC). The FNSSC will ensure enhanced government representation to all National Specialty Societies in Canada.

Dr. Édith Guilbert Receives the Marion Powell Award

Dr. Édith Guilbert received the 2003 Marion Powell Award for her work as an activist, which made it possible for pharmacists in Québec to dispense emergency contraceptives.

In 2001, thanks in part to Dr. Guilbert's contribution and to five years of lobbying by the Public Health Directions of Québec, the College of Physicians authorized pharmacists to prescribe emergency contraceptives.

Presented each year by Sunnybrook and

Women's College Health Sciences Centre and Organon Canada Ltd., the Marion Powell Award recognizes an individual who has demonstrated leadership, commitment and dedication to the advocacy of women's health. The award is named for Dr. Marion Powell, a physician and leader in the field of women's health from 1946 until her death in 1997. Dr. Guilbert is the second Quebecer to receive this award.

In addition to her role as Chair for the

committee on increased access to emergency contraception in Québec, Dr. Guilbert also served

as Co-Chair for the Canadian Consensus on Contraception of the SOGC. She is currently the Director of the Direction of Public Health's Committee on Teenage Pregnancy Prevention Program for Québec-Centre.

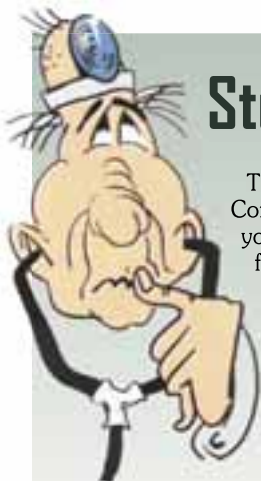
